

A Reading from the New Testament 1 Corinthians 15. 12-20

¹² But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. ¹⁵ More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Reflection

Some poor soul in Columbia University, whom I suggest needs to get out more and 'get a life', did a study and found that the average person makes about 70 decisions every day. That's 25,500 decisions a year. In a 70-year lifespan, it is 1 million,788 thousand, 500 choices.

All four readings today are about choices. For Jeremiah it to make a choice between 'those who trust in mere mortals' and 'those who trust in the Lord' The psalm warns us not to 'follow the path of the wicked, not to mix with 'sinners and scoffers'. Those who trust in 'mere mortals' and who don't choose the best company, are likened to dry shrubs and chaff in desert wilderness dry and blown about rootless and without sustenance.

In contrast those who turn in trust to God and take care how they live are like trees, deep rooted planted by water green and fruitful. Unaffected by drought or heat. Illustrations far more vivid to people living in that country compared to ours.

St Paul draws alternatives between a resurrection faith, and a life which is without hope if Christ is not raised to life again. Make up your minds, reason it out he says, if Christ is not raised then neither is anyone else and we are as lost as ever. If all we get out of Christ is a little inspiration for a few short years, we are a pretty sorry lot. But the truth is that Christ has been raised up, the first in a long legacy of those who are going to follow.

The portion from the gospel you will recognise as what is commonly called the beatitudes; blessed are the poor, the hungry and so on, they are but a part of Jesus' teaching. In Matthew's gospel he brings all the teaching together in three chapters, Luke spreads it throughout his gospel. But if we take an overview, in all the teaching illustrations Jesus gives, we cannot miss the point; Jesus is setting before us choices, and he calls us to choose.

There really are only two options. Jesus sets it out in parables to the crowds. He speaks in parables, stories with pictures, the sower, the prodigal son, the good Samaritan, weeds and wheat growing together, mustard seeds and yeast.

Jesus will talk about two gates, the narrow and the wide, two trees, two fruits good and bad, two masters, God or wealth, two foundations, rock or sand.

To follow Jesus is to make a choice; to choose to follow Him, to live under Him in His kingdom, love Him, and serve Him.

There is the key point here that we must not miss. Read the text carefully and you will see that both Luke and Matthew tell us that this teaching was given to his disciples, not the crowds. His teaching was for those who were his closest followers and carefully preserved by the early church and now for us.

It is a Christian counterculture; a value system, ethical standard, religious devotion, attitude to money, ambition, lifestyle and relationships, all of which are the total opposite of the non-Christian world. We are to choose to love our enemies, to bless and forgive, to be salt and light in all areas of our life. This is life in the kingdom of God, a fully human life lived out under divine rule.

In both accounts of this teaching there is one final illustration although not in the text this week. Listen to these words bearing in mind this teaching is to believers:

"Why do you call Me, Lord, Lord, and do not [practice] what I tell you? For everyone who comes to Me and listens to My words in order to heed their teaching and does them, I will show you what he is like:

He is like a man building a house, who dug and went down deep and laid a foundation upon the rock; and when a flood arose, the torrent broke against that house and could not shake or move it, because it had been securely built or founded on a rock.

But he who merely hears and does not practice doing My words is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation, against which the torrent burst, and immediately it collapsed and fell, and the breaking and ruin of that house was great."

It Is possible for us to sit under the teachings of Jesus and to do no more, just believe that they are wise and good but do nothing. To call Jesus Lord, but not to do what he calls us to do. You see, it is again a choice.

What we believe has to be worked out by faith, faith is action. When we begin to put belief into faith – we make decisions which are life giving. We are able to endure what life throws at us. We are like the trees by the running streams, enduring drought and heat, our lives stand secure upon the rock which is Christ.

This is how some of our daily 70 choices can become the blessedness of which Jesus speaks. Choices – no one can make them for us, but we have no choice but to choose.

Lord Jesus, help us not to be just hearers but doers. By your grace increase within us an awareness of the promptings of your Spirit. Draw us as a church and as individuals into a closer and joyous relationship with you as we yield to you every area of our lives so that we may be a blessing to our church, our families and those we meet. We ask this to the glory of your name. Amen

Situations beyond imagining but not beyond you. Keep us from praying empty words for the troubles

of the world seem too big for our little prayers. May we dare to pray that you will make us alert to needs around us and then willing to do something to help as we are able

 for we are often the answer to our own prayers.
 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to the family of faith.
